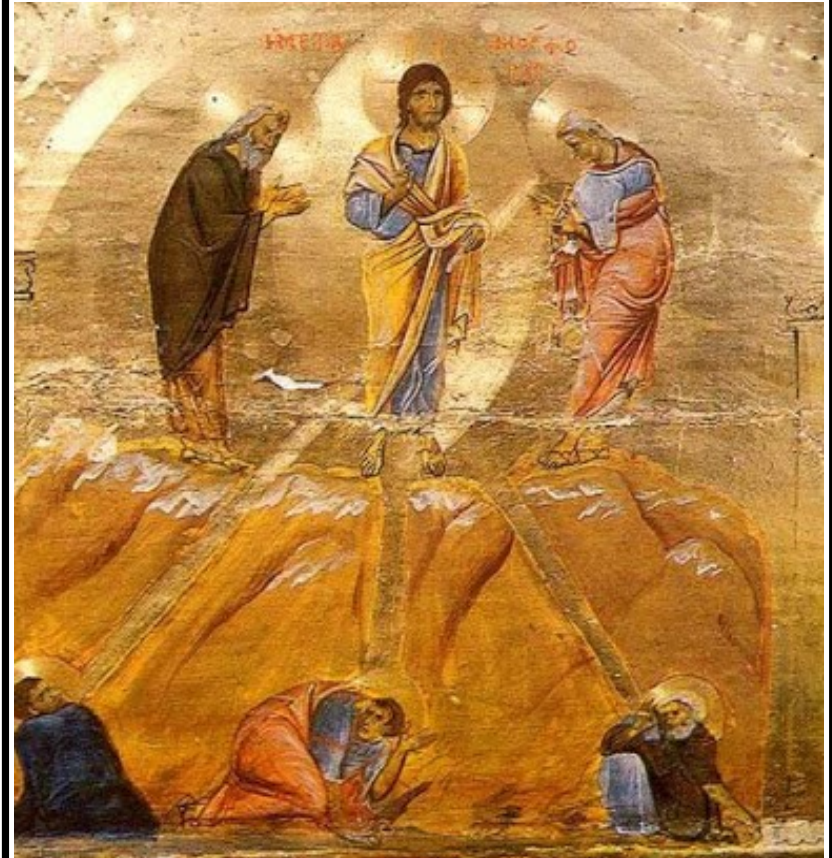

### **The Primate's World Relief and Development Fund Update**

PWRDF has raised \$379,000 for emergency relief in Africa. This total will be matched 1:1 by the Federal Government's Famine Relief Fund. With the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, PWRDF is working with local partners in South Sudan supporting food distribution. Closer to home, the Fund is consulting with dioceses in B.C. affected by the wildfires.
