## The Calendar

### At Night

Most of our lives are spent awake and, these days, most of our time awake is spent indoors. But for about a third of our lives we are asleep. The Celtic church emphasized God's omnipresence in the world around us. It was an outdoor church, flourishing at a time when most people's waking lives took place outdoors, just like most of the Bible narratives. The Celts, perhaps because they are most well known from an earlier time, perhaps because life then seems to us to have been less complicated, although I doubt they would have thought of life as easy, do seem to represent a simpler faith. They talked to Jesus through the day and knew Him as their friend. They feared the night. Darkness was total and the time of dreams. Some expected attack in their sleep in world we rationalize but they knew to be spiritual. Others knew sleep is a time of healing. So before they slept they asked for God's surrounding presence to guard and protect them. Pat Robson has published *A Celtic Liturgy*, recreating Celtic observances for us. Here is *Night Prayer*:

Here at the end of the day, in the stillness of the night, I pray.

My Lord, you created me and you know me. I am your child.

Read a psalm.

My Father, the day is over and the shadows of night fall softly round me. I thank you for the many blessings of the day, for the people I have met and the good friends who have helped me on my way, for the special moments of joy which have made my heart glad, and for giving me the opportunity to show your love to others. My Father, I long to serve you aright. I am truly sorry for those moments where I failed you. Forgive me, that I may lie down this night in peace. Amen.

May the peace of the night enfold me, so that I may be bathed in love.  
The love of the Father who made me,  
The love of the Son who died for me,  
The love of the Spirit who dwells within me,  
Bless me and keep me. Amen.

May Heaven come close as I sleep this night, and angels surround me with Christ's pure light. Amen. Amen.

## The Gospel

The Holy Gospel is written in the first chapter of the Gospel according to Saint John beginning at the 29th verse. *(BCP)*

**Glory be to thee, O Lord.** *(BCP)*

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. *(BAS)*

**Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.** *(BAS)*

The next day John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God." The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

### A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away! The Lord called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. He made my mouth like a sharp sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." But I said, "I have laboured in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord, and my reward with my God." And now the Lord says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honoured in the sight of the Lord, and my God has become my strength he says, "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." Thus says the Lord, the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations, the slave of rulers, "Kings shall see and stand up, princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the Lord, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you." *(Isaiah 49:1-7)*

He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God; many shall see, and stand in awe, and put their trust in the Lord. *Refrain.*

Happy are they who trust in the Lord! they do not resort to evil spirits or turn to false gods. Great things are they that you have done, O Lord my God! how great your wonders and your plans for us! there is none who can be compared with you. Oh, that I could make them known and tell them! but they are more than I can count. *Refrain.*

In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure (you have given me ears to hear you); Burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not required, and so I said, "Behold, I come. *Refrain.*

In the roll of the book it is written concerning me: 'I love to do your will, O my God; your law is deep in my heart.'" I proclaimed righteousness in the great congregation; behold, I did not restrain my lips; and that, O Lord, you know. *Refrain.*

Your righteousness have I not hidden in my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your deliverance; I have not concealed your love and faithfulness from the great congregation. You are the Lord; do not withhold your compassion from me; let your love and your faithfulness keep me safe for ever. *Refrain.*

**A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians**

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. *(1 Corinthians 1:1-9)*
